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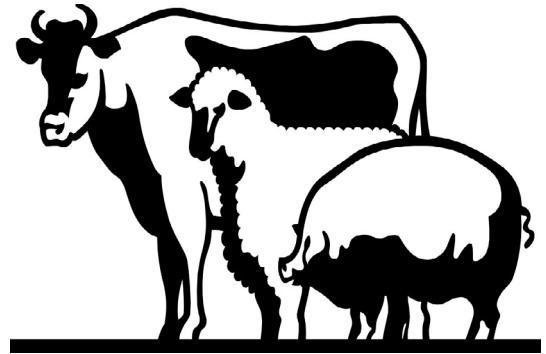

Chief Building Official Information: All decks require building Permits. Some property owners have incorrect information about the requirements for Building Permits relating to decks. For example:
 “Deck is not attached to house” – **Building Permit is required.** “I’m replacing - repairing an existing deck” - **Building Permit is required.** “My deck is less than 24” above the ground” - **Building Permit is required.** “My deck is only a small landing and stairs at my door” - **Building Permit is required.** “I’m adding a new railing/stairway/extension/etc. to my deck” - **Building Permit is required.** **If you are planning to build or change a deck, check with the Building Official whether you need a permit.**
Don’t rely on others for this information.

During a Tornado

- Avoid cars and mobile homes**
- More than half of all deaths from tornadoes happen in mobile homes.
 - Find shelter elsewhere, preferably in a building with a strong foundation.
 - If no shelter is available, lie down in a ditch away from the car or mobile home. Beware of flooding from downpours and be prepared to move.
- If you are in a house**
- Go to the basement or take shelter in a small interior ground floor room such as a bathroom, closet, or hallway.
 - If you have no basement, protect yourself by taking shelter under a heavy table or desk.
 - In all cases, stay away from windows, outside walls and doors.

- If you live on a farm**
- Livestock hear and sense impending tornadoes. If your family or home is at risk, the livestock will be a non-issue. If your personal safety is not an issue, you may only have time to open routes of escape for your livestock. Open the gate, if you must, and then exit the area in a tangent direction away from the expected path of the twister.
- If you are in an office or apartment building**
- Take shelter in an inner hallway or room, ideally in the basement or on the ground floor.
 - Do not use the elevator.
 - Stay away from windows.
- If you are driving**
- If you spot a tornado in the distance, go to the nearest solid shelter.
 - If the tornado is close, get out of your car and take cover in a low-lying area, such as a ditch.

- If you are in a gymnasium, Church, or auditorium**
- Large buildings with wide-span roofs may collapse if a tornado hits.
 - If possible, find shelter in another building.
 - If you are in one of these buildings and cannot leave, take cover under a sturdy structure such as a table or desk.



- In all cases**
- Get as close to the ground as possible, protect your head and watch for flying debris.
 - Do not chase tornadoes - they are unpredictable and can change course abruptly.
 - A tornado is deceptive. It may appear to be standing still but is, in fact, moving toward you.
