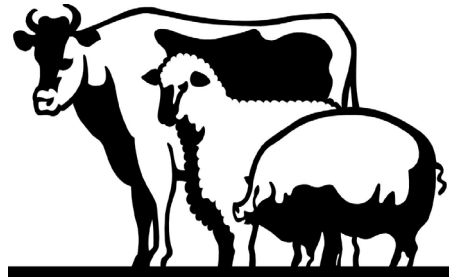

BURN PERMITS

Are to be purchased online <https://chapple.burnpermits.com/> Permits are needed from January 1st to December 31st



Chief Building Official Information: All decks require building Permits. Some property owners have incorrect information about the requirements for Building Permits relating to decks. For example: "Deck is not attached to house" – **Building Permit is required.** "I'm replacing - repairing an existing deck" - **Building Permit is required.** "My deck is less than 24" above the ground" - **Building Permit is required.** "My deck is only a small landing and stairs at my door" - **Building Permit is required.** "I'm adding a new railing/stairway/extension/etc. to my deck" - **Building Permit is required.** **If you are planning to build or change a deck, check with the Building Official whether you need a permit. Don't rely on others for this information.**

72-HOUR KIT

This kit should be stored in an accessible place so that it can be easily reached in a hurry.

- Important Papers-passports, copies of birth certificate, driver's licence
- Copy of emergency contact list
- Copy of emergency family plan
- Mobile phone (solar) charger or spare battery pack
- Extra car keys and cash
- Flashlight and batteries
- Radio and batteries (or a crank radio)
- Spare batteries for radio and flashlight
- Whistle (to attract attention)
- Necessities for babies and pets (if applicable)
- Blankets or sleeping bag
- Clothing and footwear
- Medication/prescriptions
- Candles and matches/lighter
- Bottled water-6L per person
- Toilet paper, hand sanitizer and personal hygiene items
- Non-perishable food (i.e. canned fruit, vegetables and meat)
- Manual can opener
- First Aid Kit



- Playing cards
- Backpack to store/carry 72-Hour kit items
