Why Chimney Safety Matters More Than You Think

Chimneys may seem like simple structures, but when neglected, they can become serious hazards. Here's why chimney safety is essential for protecting your home, health, and peace of mind:

1. Prevents Chimney Fires


Creosote buildup—a flammable residue from burning wood—is the leading cause of chimney fires

2. Ensures Proper Ventilation

- A blocked or dirty chimney can trap **smoke and toxic gases** like carbon monoxide inside your home.
- Poor airflow increases the risk of **respiratory issues**, especially for children and the elderly.

3. Improves Heating Efficiency

- A clean chimney allows your fireplace or stove to **burn more efficiently**, saving fuel and money.



Regular inspection and maintenance is paramount

Have your chimney inspected and swept on a regular basis by an approved chimney sweep

- twice a year** when burning wood
- once a year** when burning smokeless fuels



Fire Prevention Week is October 5-11, 2025 – Smoke Alarm Safety



Chapple Fire Department is teaming up with NFPA to promote this year's Fire Prevention Week, October 5-11, *Charge Into Fire Safety: Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home*. Help us spread the word about making smart choices when it comes to buying, charging, and recycling lithium-ion batteries—because the wrong move can lead to a fire.

Charge any lithium-ion battery device on a hard surface—never on your bed, couch, or under a pillow. And don't overcharge. Once it's at 100%, unplug and move on.



Charge devices safely. Unplug when fully charged.



Charging something big like an e-bike, scooter, or power tool with a lithium ion battery? Do it outside. Use a flat, dry area away from direct sunlight, anything wet, kids, or tripping hazards. And make sure your bike or device is secure—so it doesn't fall while charging. Always use the charger that came with the device or one approved by the manufacturer. If the cord only works when you bend it just right, it's time to replace it.
